RCMP Boat Moors at LMS

If you see RCMP cruisers in the parking lot, it will most likely signify that officers are out doing enforcement on the water. Relocating of police moorage to LMS makes a significant difference in response time, first in getting to the vessel, and second for a faster exit from the harbour.

LMS Capital Asset Plan

LMS maintains a \$2 million asset base, much of it afloat, and exposed to salt water and weather. This is why the Board are moving to create a multi-year plan to ensure the assets are well managed with a regular repair and maintenance schedule. The plan will be reviewed by the Board in June.
