3. Education Program

- Continuing to look into getting touch tanks and lighting for the Sea Life Centre
- Researching the sea life traditionally used for food by the Stz'uminus First Nation
- Updating the Sea Life of Ladysmith Harbour booklet with help from marine biologist, Rick Harbo.
- The oyster industry book, *Mom was an Oyster Farmer* by Myfanwy Plecas is being edited and soon will be printed. It will become a new resource book for our Education Program.
- Continuing to cooperate with schools, community members, SFN and LDHS on our education programs' heritage/cultural education booklets. We are making great progress. The two Purple Martin booklets written by our 2015 summer student, Jennika Erickson are being transcribed to Hul-q-umi-num by Pearl Harris. These booklets written in both languages will be for young children. The project is supported by Ladysmith Maritime Society, Stz' uminus First Nation, Ladysmith & District Historical Society and Georgia Basin Ecological Assessment and Restoration Society BC Purple Martin Stewardship & Recovery Program. I feel this collaborative effort is most rewarding and very important to LMS goals.

- We are exploring options for more space. We have discussed closing in the back of the Maritime Museum, obtaining space on the ground floor of the Machine Shop or obtaining a new or used boat house for:
 - 8 unique small heritage boats that are not suitable to be stored in the water

 - An inside classroom for our education program
