Sea Life Celebration is a new event, Sunday, August 13th, at your LMS Community Marina: the perfect opportunity to introduce young people of any age to the magic and wonder of the Ladysmith Harbour. There will be hands-on activities, special projects, and special visitors to bring together families under the "big tent", in the Sea Life Centre, and on the 'Maritimer' Harbour Tour Boat.

The Ladysmith Maritime Society exists to serve the community!

- on **May 7th**, LMS and the Nanaimo Paddlers conducted a **harbour clean-up** from Shell Beach to Woods Islands to Fishermen's Wharf. Watch the video on Take5TV!
- the **Oyster Bay Café** opened **May 19th**, seven days a week 0800-1500h. Come on down to savour the harbour at the Welcome Centre.
- **May 25th**, Executive Director, Rod Smith, provided a presentation to the Downtown Business Association on **tourism benefits** flowing through the LMS waterfront gateway. The results were well reported in the Ladysmith-Chemainus Chronicle
- on **May 29th**, the **Heritage Boat Festival** hosted 22 vessels, including Walronda, built in 1912 in Hong Kong, and also featuring our own Yellowpoint Cutter.
- **June 3rd**, **Kids Pirate Day** saw close to 3000 citizens, big and small, on the LMS docks, with the Saravan delivering Cap'n Jack Sparrow and scalliwags to the LMS docks. Congratulations to Adrian Perez, winner of the family movie pass.
- through the summer, LMS will focus on **Dine on the Docks** (only \$20, always sold-out; never rains, and even if it does there is the big top), on operating the **Harbour Museum and SeaLife Centre**, and on **marina services** for visiting boaters.
- **Music on the Docks** is a newer event, happening Tuesdays at 730pm (open mic) and Thursdays at 7pm during the summer.
- **Harbour Tours** will be available daily at 1030h and 1400h...\$15 for adults; \$40 for a family of four; \$80 for the whole boat...with custom tours negotiable. We recommend you phone ahead to book your spot!
