BOATHOUSE INSPECTIONS AND MOORAGE

Boathouse Inspections are now complete. At times it seems like standards are being constantly upgraded, but both staff and your board of directors feel there is really no alternative but to follow practices which have become the norm in maintaining safety and security in marine facilities. A big thank you to all who have cooperated. Moorage contracts, too, have been updated and completed, with the additional process of ensuring that all contracts are demonstrably suitable to the marine asset involved. This step will ensure that fairness in the long term is both perceived and in place, and that regardless of individuals or staff involved the process will stand as fair from an objective standpoint. In addition a revenue sharing scheme has been implemented whereby a moorer absent for a period of time (for example taking their vessel out for a summer cruise) can share in the benefit if their spot is utilized for visitor moorage short term by LMS. Overall these steps present a fair and more businesslike approach to our operations.
